

Brief History of Tinajero

Tinajero Bacolor is once an abandoned area since the catastrophic damage of Pinatubo lahar in 1991 and massive flooding in 1995. Then was a rich and progressive village, abundance of food flows and have livelihood opportunities. It was said that the people of Tinajero are very good in producing the local vinegar. This was exported at that time. More than that, many came from Tinajero and work as domestic helpers in Singapore and Taiwan. This time was the beginning when Philippines started exporting human resources. Since Pinatubo and the massive lahar flooding the community fell down, abandoned and deserted.

Presently, there are about 1,000 people living in the area which includes the children. People's occupation depends solely on the men's carpentry work and on farming vegetables. According to survey probing it would take about 100 peso a day for a normal family to spend on food. Due to meagre salary and job opportunity, many youth were not able to go to high school; malnutrition is evident to the children. This lack of opportunity to education resulted to teenage pregnancy, juvenile delinquency, malnutrition on the children, poor hygiene practices, alcoholism among others.

In 2014 Barangay Tinajero has a population of about **800** with a household number of 200. However, an influx of population reached to 995 with a household 762 due to the construction of San Guillermo housing and the return of evacuees of Pinatubo.

At present, the thriving houses and structures are built along the road are apparent as the community is **re-building**. More concrete houses are built as evidence that the community life and living has develop. Moreover, barangay road was concreted last 2016. However, the drainage system was not properly built and completed. In the recent months some parts of the road are damaged due to the heavy equipment passing from the construction of dike along the boundary of Tinajero and Talba.

Furthermore, to mitigate flooding in the community just as what happened in 2009 (Ondoy) and 2016 (Niña), a dike was strengthened by the local government along Talba boundary and a river was built as a waterway from Sta. Ynes.

Every Barangay should be equipped with facilities in order to cater the general public. However this is lacking in Tinajero. The Barangay Multi-purpose which is used as a Barangay Hall and at the same time a Health Center is dilapidated which is evident by the fragmented parts of the structure. There seem to be no regular assigned person to manage the office as well as Barangay police to guard it. Usually whenever there are conflicts in the community people would still go to Municipal Hall, no one is around to facilitate the problem among parties.

On waste management, there is a prevalent culture of burning of garbage whenever and wherever people preferred to. On the worse, garbage is evidently thrown at the roadside which causes stench along the way.

The community is on the way of re-establishment and developing, establishments for basic needs such as grocery, food processing, services and alike are not yet visible.

We looked around San Guillermo Resettlement. There are around 200 families. Other houses are not yet occupied. According to a random interview, livelihood is difficult and the location is far. The area is small and hot. Furthermore, the covered court is still under construction. Because lacks of
